Background Information on Canadian ISD:

Canadian, Texas has a population of 2,400 people and is located in the northeast corner of the Texas Panhandle about 100 miles northeast of Amarillo.

Canadian ISD is a 1A school district with 790 students from Pre K to 12th grade and has 720 square miles in the school district. The closest junior college is 70 miles away. The closest college is 110 miles away.

Currently Canadian High School offers the following seven dual credit courses (there are no AP or IB classes offered on site at the school):

In addition to the dual credit courses listed above, Canadian ISD offers high school students the opportunity to take any online class for high school credit or college credit including any AP classes offered online. These courses are taken by students during one or more periods of their eight period school day in a computer lab with a certified teacher present. The school pays 100% of the cost for these online classes.

Recent positive developments with dual credit courses:

HB 2480 (Rep. Hochberg, Rep. Guillen, and Sen. Seliger) passed last session was very helpful in allowing more competition between junior colleges for dual credit courses. This bill allowed junior colleges to go outside of their service area and work with any high school in Texas. More competition is great! Being a captive to one junior college was not the ideal situation. We appreciate the legislature for helping high schools gain access to all the junior colleges in our state.

Problems Canadian ISD sees with dual credit courses:

- Rural schools need more access to all types of courses, including dual credit courses.
- We are not always pleased with the level of rigor in some dual credit courses.
- Many Ivy League colleges do not recognize or accept Texas dual credit courses. For the most part, Ivy League colleges only recognize AP or IB classes.
- dual credit classes, UIL academic competitions, and AP classes are not aligned with each other as well as they could be.

Solutions for rural schools:

Texas needs to commit more money to online learning and online curriculum. This will help increase the number of dual credit classes and other classes available to school children in Texas. Taking text book money or other money and directing it toward electronic, interactive, virtual learning media would improve educational opportunities for the school children across our state and would save Texas billions of dollars!
