

If you're like me and most other Texans, you don't like the idea of people spending their entire careers in elected office. People who do usually have little to no "real world" experience and can easily become disengaged and out of touch with the people they're supposed to be representing. Ridding Austin of "career politicians" is one of the reasons I ran to be your state Senator, and it's the first elected office I've ever held!

I know how important this issue is to Texas voters and to the future of our great state, which is why, during the 84th Legislature (2015), I filed legislation to create term limits for all elected officials in Texas: statewide elected officials, the Texas Legislature, judges, local officials, and even certain appointed state officers. Too many people holding office for too long can lead to stale leadership. Term limits create the opportunity for more people from diverse backgrounds and professions to get involved in public service. This brings new perspectives and fresh ideas for solving old problems.

Some people argue that requiring officials to be re-elected acts as a de facto term limit. The thought process being that constituents who feel their elected representative is out of touch can remove that person from office through the ballot box. This ignores the reality that incumbent candidates can be extremely difficult to unseat. Many people are able to get re-elected based solely on name recognition and the ability to fundraise, both of which are significant advantages enjoyed by incumbents. Term limits take away this advantage and level the playing field, returning power to the voters.

Limited time in office will help keep elected officials focused on the job they were actually elected to do: make and execute good public policy for the people of Texas. Texans deserve elected officials who are more interested in serving their constituents than trading political favors in hopes of getting re-elected. As the next legislative session approaches, I am actively pursuing legislation that would implement term limits for every elected office in Texas, including statewide office holders, state legislators, and even judges. Serving the interests of the people of Senate District 16 is my highest priority, so I will fight hard to make the 85th Legislature (2017) the one that finally brings term limits to Texas!

As your state Senator, it is my job to be your representative in Austin. I work for you-not the government-which is why I refuse to take the Senate salary, healthcare, travel expense reimbursements, or any state pension. Please do not hesitate to contact me.
