Opposition to Current Redistricting Proposal

Honorable Senators,

My name is Jeanne Dupre' Weido, and I am appealing to you today as a concerned Texas citizen to voice my strong opposition to the current redistricting proposal that will undermine the fundamental democratic principle of fair representation.

Redistricting should serve the people of Texas, not political parties. Yet what we've witnessed is the deliberate manipulation of district boundaries to predetermine electoral outcomes—a practice that betrays the trust Texans place in their elected officials and violates the basic tenets of democratic governance.

The current redistricting proposal fails Texas in three critical ways:

First, it silences voters. When district lines are drawn to guarantee specific outcomes, millions of Texans find their votes effectively meaningless. Communities are carved up and scattered across multiple districts, ensuring their voices are diluted beyond recognition. This is not democracy—this is disenfranchisement by design.

Second, it destroys community representation. I've witnessed neighborhoods, cities, and counties split in ways that make no logical sense except to serve partisan advantage. Rural communities find themselves grouped with distant urban centers they share nothing with. Historic neighborhoods are fractured. These artificial divisions prevent elected officials from truly understanding and serving the diverse needs of their constituents.

Third, it perpetuates extremism and gridlock. When districts are drawn to be "safe" for one party, the real election happens in the primary, not the general election. This incentivizes candidates to appeal to their party's most extreme voices rather than building the broad coalitions necessary for effective governance. The result is increased

polarization and decreased ability to address Texas's real challenges.

The evidence is overwhelming.

Federal courts have repeatedly found Texas redistricting plans to be discriminatory. We've spent millions of taxpayer dollars defending indefensible maps in federal court—money that should have been invested in our schools, infrastructure, and communities.

Texans deserve better.

We deserve districts drawn by nonpartisan commissions focused on keeping communities together, respecting natural and political boundaries, and ensuring equal representation. We deserve a process that's transparent, with meaningful public input, not backroom deals that predetermine our political future.

Other states have shown this is possible. Independent redistricting commissions in states like Arizona and California have created fairer, more competitive districts while reducing costly litigation and restoring public trust in the electoral process.

I urge you to reject redistricting before the next census is conducted. Establish an independent redistricting commission with clear criteria: equal population, compliance with the Voting Rights Act, preservation of communities of interest, geographic compactness, and respect for existing political boundaries.

Texas has always prided itself on independence and fairness. Our redistricting process should reflect these values, not contradict them. The integrity of our democracy depends on ensuring every Texan's vote counts equally, regardless of party affiliation, race, or geographic location.

Thank you for your time and consideration. I trust you will act in the best interests of all Texans by supporting fair, transparent, and nonpartisan redistricting reform.
