I need to speak out strongly against this Congressional Redistricting plan.

This isn't just bad redistricting; it's a blatant partisan push, designed primarily as a political tool for one party, not based on geographic or community needs - this is pure gerrymandering.

These districts are being drawn to specifically advantage one side and disadvantage another in upcoming elections. The manipulation isn't subtle; it's direct evidence of trying to control outcomes unfairly. Pushing such partisan lines out of cycle when there is not even a census to justify required changes is an extreme example of partisan interference with the political process. These proposed maps demonstrate a disregard for fair representation and ensuring all voices are heard.

There has been no justification provided with valid reasons on why this should be considered at this time. This undermines democracy itself by creating uneven political playing fields where the actual preferences of people living in these manipulated areas aren't heard. It ignores fundamental principles of our democracy and threatens to divide out country even more.

I strongly push for this plan to redistrict at this time be abandoned. If any redistricting is required it should be re-visited after the next census when there is valid data and good reasoning behind changing the districts. True representation should never have a district that spans half of the state as the concerns for citizens in those areas will be vastly different. While I do have concerns about some of our current districts being obviously drawn for political reasoning instead of for representation we should be looking at correcting those instead of pushing even worse representation of our residents.

These proposed districts are fundamentally illegitimate, prioritizing partisan gain over equal representation for all Texas residents.
