I write as a native Texan and lifelong voter who cherishes fair elections. I strongly oppose any attempt to redraw our electoral maps outside of the census-driven process. By law and tradition, Texas redraws districts only once every ten years after the census. Mid-decade map changes are virtually unheard of and usually happen only after a major shift in legislative power. Doing this now, with no new census data, undermines the stability of our system and the trust of voters.

This proposal feels less like good governance and more like a partisan power grab. In recent hearings, concerned Texans called it a bait-and-switch with a power grab added in. Even U.S. Representative Lizzie Fletcher called this mid-decade redistricting an attack on the citizens of Texas and on our right to choose the people we want to represent us. Redrawing lines now would blatantly circumvent the will of the people, tamp down fair representation, and give outsiders an outsized say in our elections.

We must protect public trust in democracy. Fair representation requires that maps reflect real population shifts, not midterm political calculations. To uphold integrity and respect voters, I urge you to reject off-cycle redistricting and keep changes tied to the next official census. Texans deserve transparent, lawful processes—not rushed maneuvers that dilute our vote.
