My name is Yim Meyer and I live in Austin. I am representing myself as “On” regarding redistricting.

Growing up in Hong Kong, I’ve seen how vibrant and outspoken the city once was—its independent judiciary, free press, and open internet were rare in the region. The erosion of those freedoms isn’t just political; it’s emotional and cultural. It affects how people speak, gather, and even dream. How quickly a society can shift under centralized control.

Four years ago this Legislature adopted new congressional maps, which the majority of the members claimed were drawn fairly and without racial prejudice –today those maps are still being challenged by the courts.
