Hello committee members, my name is Brandon Schneider, I live in cd 18 and I am against redrawing these district maps. I will say, I am not political, I don't know much about politics, but what I do know a lot about is maps. I work with 9-1-1 call data for routing emergency calls to ensure the data is accurate and precise to ensure emergency calls get from the caller, to the call center where they can accurately locate where the call is coming from and what services respond to that area. When an emergency responding agency goes through an annexation process, it is not done because the County Judge tells the chief "we need more money" or "we need to increase our call volume" it's because the accurate and current data dictates it. I am currently in the middle of processing an annexation between a municipality and a County, we have held meetings with all agencies involved, more than three times, presented updated/accurate data for responders, and have exchanged updates back and forth that at the end of the day, all parties involved have agreed upon. This is the process for saving lives, it's long and must be incredibly accurate.
