Message:

Let's be clear: this process is not democratic. You've called a hearing without even showing the public the proposed maps. That alone undermines trust in the process. Texans deserve transparency, not performative input sessions.

Redistricting is meant to happen once per decade, after the census. That's what ensures fairness and consistency. But what you're doing here—redrawing maps mid-cycle with no clear data justification—looks like a blatant power grab. It's political, not principled.

You say this is about addressing concerns from the Department of Justice. But up until last week, the state insisted these maps were race-blind and constitutionally sound. The sudden change in rationale doesn't track. It looks more like political cover than legal necessity.

Let's not ignore the fact that many of the districts at risk are represented by Black and Latino lawmakers. Communities of color fought hard for representation. Redrawing their districts with no transparency and no justification sends a message that their voices are disposable.

And the pressure reportedly coming from national figures like Donald Trump? That's not leadership, that's capitulation. Our maps should reflect the will of Texans, not the political strategy of one man trying to re-engineer election outcomes.

If you care about democracy, due process, and the basic right of voters to choose their representatives—not the other way around—then you must stop this process now. Don't bury trust in government for the sake of political advantage.
