Members of the Texas Senate,

I'm writing today to express my strong opposition to the mid-decade redistricting efforts currently being prioritized during this Special Session. Texans have yet to see a single map, and yet you're rushing forward based on a deeply flawed and contradictory letter from the DOJ—without transparency, public input, or any mandate requiring this to happen now.

Why now? Our communities are still reeling from catastrophic flooding that has taken the lives of more than 135 Texans. In the first seven days of this session, Senate Republicans haven't filed a single bill to address the ongoing disaster or help families rebuild. Instead, you're laser focused on redrawing maps—not flood maps to protect lives, but political maps to protect power. That's a shameful abdication of leadership.

I urge you to stop breaking up communities like mine. An electoral district should be a community of interest—a group of people who share economic, cultural, and social ties, with common needs around education, infrastructure, and health care. By splitting communities of color, you are engaging in racial gerrymandering, which is illegal and immoral. Call it what it is: not just a power grab, but a targeted, racial dismantling of democratic representation.

Texans deserve a Legislature focused on real issues, not on chasing Donald Trump's political agenda. We deserve flood relief, Medicaid expansion, school funding, and real solutions—not mid-decade redistricting driven by partisan gamesmanship.

Please put people before politics. Stop this process, refocus on real needs, and keep our communities whole.
