The mid-decade redistricting demanded by the Republican President of the United States and the Republican governor of Texas must be rejected.

It is nothing but another blatant Republican attempt to suppress voter choice and further cement Republican rule by making it impossible for the majority of voters in Texas to elect the candidate of their choice in any district.

Republicans' 2021 redistricting plan was bad enough and is, in fact, still tied up in court because of its likely unconstitutional packing and cracking of Black votes.
