Redistricting in Texas before the 2026 midterms isn't just unnecessary—it's deeply unfair, and it threatens the heart of our democracy. Redistricting before 2026 is not only a legal and political risk—it's a moral one. If we let it happen, we send a message that fairness and equality are optional. But if we speak out, if we demand transparency and justice, we can protect the power of every Texan's vote. Democracy belongs to the people—not the politicians trying to bend it to their will.
