opportunity to engage—not three
days' notice, with no public
maps, and no clear justification
for why these changes are
happening.

At a time when residents in the 18th District are still without representation, and families in the Hill Country continue to wait for flood relief, this effort feels like a clear misplacement of priorities.

I respectfully urge this Committee to:

Publicly explain why the maps are being redrawn mid-decade;

Make all communications and justifications for redistricting decisions available to the public;

Conduct an independent analysis of how the proposed changes will impact communities of color;

And commit to holding a second public hearing once maps are available, and before any vote occurs.

My family's sacrifice taught me the value of having a voice in our democracy. I offer this comment in the hope that this body will choose to honor that history—and the future of the communities you represent—by ensuring this process is fair, transparent, and inclusive.
