My name is Mary Diane Baker and I am a retired certified Church Business Administrator. I am a constituent of Lloyd Doggett and I vote in every election. As a Texan, I wish that this legislature would work on empowering voting and making voting easier. Instead, I am here to testify against this horrible attempt to redraw our congressional districts in the middle of the decade. I live in the Canyon Creek neighborhood of far northwest Austin, Texas, a minority majority neighborhood filled with extremely knowledgable people from the tech industry. I was happy my children grew up in an area with such diversity. I share schools, community events, and life with these neighbors and I should share representatives with them, not with Brenham and Houston suburbs like we did when our little neighborhood was gerrymandered into Michael McCalls district previously.
