I am writing today to express my strong opposition to the proposed redistricting maps currently under consideration. These maps, reportedly pushed by President Trump and designed to secure additional partisan advantages, fundamentally undermine the principles of fair representation and democratic governance.

As members of this committee, you have taken an oath to faithfully execute the duties of your office and to the best of your ability preserve, protect, and defend the Constitution and laws of the United States and of this State. That oath is to the citizens of Texas, to uphold the integrity of our democratic process.

Redistricting is a critical process that should reflect the diverse and growing population of Texas, ensuring that every citizen has an equal voice in our democracy. Instead, these proposed maps appear to be a blatant attempt at partisan gerrymandering, manipulating district lines to favor one political party over another. This not only disenfranchises voters but also creates districts where elected officials are less accountable to the true will of the people. Fair and free elections are at the very core of our democracy. They are the mechanism by which the people's will is expressed and by which government derives its legitimacy. Are you willing to sacrifice that fundamental principle to appease any individual or political agenda? The current discussions surrounding these maps, including concerns about their potential to dilute the voting power of minority communities and the unusual timing of this

redrawing outside of the decennial census, raise serious questions about the transparency and fairness of this process. It is vital that our legislative districts are drawn to foster competitive elections and accurately represent the demographic shifts occurring across our state.

I urge this committee to reject any maps that prioritize partisan gain over equitable representation. Instead, I ask that you consider maps that are drawn impartially, respect existing communities of interest, and truly empower all Texans to elect representatives who will genuinely serve their interests, not the interests of a political party or outside influence.
