To Whom It May Concern,

I write to you today in deep frustration and disappointment regarding the blatant and politically motivated redistricting efforts being carried out under the influence of Donald Trump—a convicted felon who has repeatedly shown contempt for the truth, for justice, and for our Constitution.

I might ask you—what are you afraid of?
