Pre-filing of Signature Bills

As pre-filing of legislative bills continues at the Texas Capitol, my staff and I are working tirelessly to lay the groundwork necessary for a successful session. Our most important battles are to keep our state strong and conservative by defending Texas and her people against federal overreach, implementing real tax reform vital to our state's economy, and leading the charge against government waste.

The following are a few of my signature bills that have been filed for our upcoming legislative session:

State Sovereignty: There is growing sentiment that the federal government has continued to overreach its power and spending and sends a message that our nation is a union of individual and sovereign states. <u>SCR 1</u> fights federal overreach, asserting the message to Washington D.C. the powers not delegated to the nation by the Constitution are reserved to the states or to the people.

Repealing the Franchise Tax: Our state needs meaningful tax reform to lighten the burden placed upon the shoulders of small businesses in Texas. <u>SB 186</u> provides tax relief for small businesses by repealing the franchise tax.

Medicaid Fraud Prevention: I am proud to have led the charge to keep the Obamacare exchanges and associated Medicaid expansion out of Texas and will continue that fight until that failed approach is just a memory. There are inadequacies in our current system and I am determined to eradicate them during this legislative session. <u>SB</u> <u>187</u> enhances the state's ability to prevent fraud, waste and abuse in the Medicaid system.
