STATE OF TEXAS UPDATES

Governor's Executive Orders

Last Friday (June 26), Governor Greg Abbott announced that he will pause any further action to reopen Texas, and he issued an executive order to limit certain businesses and services in an effort to reduce the spread of COVID -19. His orders include the following:

- Close all bars and other establishments that receive more than 51% of their gross receipts from the sale of alcoholic beverages. These businesses may, however, remain open to offer delivery and take-out services, including alcoholic beverages, as authorized by the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission.
- Dining services for customers at restaurants may not exceed 50% of the total indoor occupancy.
- Rafting and tubing businesses must close.
- Local governments must approve outdoor gatherings of 100 or more people, with certain exceptions.

Additionally, the Governor issued a <u>proclamation</u> today to limit elective surgeries at hospitals in Cameron, Hidalgo, Nueces, an Webb counties adding to **his previous executive order** that includes Dallas, Bexar, Harris, and Travis counties.

Texas Health and Human Services Commission Receives Federal Funding for Infection Control in Texas Nursing Homes

The Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC) along with Governor Abbott announced that Texas received \$9 million in federal funding for projects to protect nursing home residents and staff from COVID-19. Nursing facility providers may submit applications to HHSC starting July 1 to receive funds to assist with infection control resources including:

- Thermometer and temperature scanning equipment for staff and residents.
- Decontamination and disinfecting systems.
- Plexiglass barriers or portable walls to ensure social distancing and droplet protection.
- N95 fit-test equipment.
- Microbe-resistant flooring and wall coverings.

Texas Armed Service Scholarship Program

My office is currently accepting applications for the <u>Texas Armed Services</u> <u>Scholarship Program (TASSP)</u>. TASSP is a program created by the Legislature in 2009 to encourage students to complete a baccalaureate degree and become a commissioned member of the Texas Army National Guard, Texas Air National Guard, Texas State Guard, U.S. Coast Guard, or U.S. Merchant Marine or become a commissioned officer in any branch of the U.S. armed services. Each legislative office has the opportunity to award a single scholarship each year for a college student who is in an ROTC program and meets the academic performance requirement.

State and Local COVID-19 Case Numbers

The Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) is <u>tracking COVID-19</u> <u>cases</u> and updates its site with the latest information each day.

- Texas has 153,011 confirmed cases of COVID-19 out of 1,819,189 viral and antibody tests. An estimated 81,335 individuals have recovered.
- There are 2,763 confirmed cases of COVID-19 involving Collin County residents out of 44,400 viral and antibody tests. An estimated 2,096 individuals have recovered.
- There are 20,165 confirmed cases of COVID-19 involving Dallas County residents out of 177,725 tests. An estimated 12,713 individuals have recovered.
