SENATOR HINOJOSA URGES LOCAL PARTICIPATION IN UPCOMING WATER DESALINATION COMMITTEE HEARINGS

AUSTIN - Senator Juan "Chuy" Hinojosa, a member of the Joint-Interim Committee to Study Water Desalination, is urging local stakeholders and water planning organizations to participate in the upcoming water desalination committee hearings this month. Senator Hinojosa had invited the committee to host hearings in Corpus Christi and the McAllen-Edinburg-Mission Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) to hear the unique water needs and challenges in South Texas and the Coastal Bend area. A committee hearing in Corpus Christi has been scheduled for June 23rd. The committee is tentatively planning a fact-finding expedition to South Texas for the near future.
