Senator César J. Blanco Appointed To Influential Senate Committees "These committees are a win for El Paso & West Texas"

Austin, Texas - Today, Lieutenant Governor Dan Patrick announced the senate committee assignments for the 87th Legislature. Senator César J. Blanco (El Paso) was appointed to four influential committees — The Senate Committees on Health & Human Services, Higher Education, Transportation, and Veteran Affairs & Border Security.

Senator Blanco issued the following statement:

"I am honored Lt. Governor Patrick has entrusted me with these key appointments. Membership on these committees are a huge win for El Paso and West Texas. These committee assignments will allow me to advocate for some of the most pressing needs in our region.

"The global pandemic has impacted all aspects of our lives. COVID-19 relief and recovery is a top priority this session. Through the **Senate Committee on Health & Human Services** I will be directly involved in shaping the state's public health policy and response to COVID-19 and addressing the health inequities that plague West Texas and border communities, including improving access to healthcare.
